Also known as "Funkadelics", French-American artist Anouk Aumont (b. 1994, CA) is self-taught as an illustrator, painter, film photographer, and Hand-Poke tattoo artist.

Aumont explores questions of gender, and targets the unrealistic expectations and deteriorative pressures put on young women by social media and other aspects of society.

"En Vacances" was created from found objects at Shila's "Artist Atelier" suite, such as brewed espresso beans, charcoal & pencil on transparency paper (from the unwrapped slippers).

Alexandria Coe


Alexandria Coe is a British artist, currently based in Athens. She studied at Chelsea College of Art before completing her masters at Central Saint Martins.

Adopting skills from her studies in textile design and illustration, she now focuses on a simplified drawing practise as a root for connecting to an authentic relationship with the body.

The main importance is a simple approach, that is something unlaboured, natural, the opposite to the complete, over-edited form.

Parisian Visual artist, b. 1978, her practice is multiple, depending on the inspirations and the worlds to be created: drawing, print-making, painting, sculpture, ceramics without silos or hierarchy.

In a world that swarms, moves and dislocates, expels debris and undesirables, Virginie Clavereau fixes sadness and hopes, disturbs, surprises and develops her saraband.

She takes hold of sick objects, resurrects the forgotten ones or those yet to be invented to propose avenues of repair, clarification, to romanticize and nimble them. Around the characters and the sad and happy scenes that she paints, she models and colors faces, incontinent vases or even memories, like the sensitive construction of unexplored spheres where, gently, poetry lies close to us.

To the clicking of amulets, lucky charms, huts and soft ghosts, alchemies, Virginie erects the totems of new spiritualities whose fluids, enigmatic and enameled, invite us into a dance that is always new and yet almost familiar.

Archer Defterios is a Contemporary artist from Los Angeles.

Known for his textural Blue Compositions, vivid palettes, and unconventional use of materials such as fire, Defterios' sky-like abstractions are the result of a cyclic process of adding and removing paints to reveal a unique depth to each of his works.

Inspired by the European PostWar and Futurist movements, Defterios' philosophy is in full encouragement of industrialization, forward thinking, and innovation.

She studied Painting and Engraving at Athens School of Fine Arts, Stop motion and Engraving at the University of Hildesheim in Germany, Painting and Graphic Design at Universität der Künste (University of Arts) in Berlin. She holds a Meisterschülerin (PhD) degree in Painting from Universität der Künste Berlin.

The artist creates dream worlds with symbolic representations and emotional intensity. A world of powerful silence that gives birth to a mystical reality of fragility and beauty. It is the uploading of an image, of what cannot be seen through the eyes of logic that fascinates us.

The structure of Anna's works is similar to the structure of a dream that happens underneath the rational surfaces. It is about the Transfiguration from the Hidden into an image.

Diane Alexandre

Diane Alexandre (b. 1983, Paris, France) is an artist & ceramist based between Paris and Athens.

Diane's work marks a point on her ongoing journey, started at a very young age at the feet of a grandparent storyteller, in search of meaning and inspiration in myths and mythological symbolism.

Diane is particularly inspired by the totemic representations of gods and archetypes in Greek mythology, the power they transmit and the close relationship with Nature

She feels their voices still talk to us from the past.



Anna Karountzou

Anna Karountzou (b.1991, Athens, Greece) is an Athens based ceramist & conservator of antiquities & works of Art.

Her work is influenced by ancient civilisations and natural materials. Anna makes vessels that provoke an earthy feeling and resemble a 'memory', using materials found in places she holds a connection with.

Her 'Thirasia' series is inspired by Anna's home-town, Santorini. Thirassia is the namesake of the island in the crater of the volcano, which for the artist exudes a wild and peaceful energy from a bygone era. These vessels recreate the shades of the volcanic landscape and the colour palette of the Cycladic architecture.

Formed by traditional hand building techniques such as the coiling method, her works are each made by hand, and constitute one of a kind pieces.

Anna Karountzou


The House of Shila commission in collaboration with the artist.

This is a limited collection of unique handmade ceramic teapots, diverse in shapes and textures, set with 2 or 4 cups.

Anna opted for materials and glazes on earthy tones that correspond with the elements of Mona.

She is inspired by nature, obsessed with the marks of time, evidently present in the essence of corrosion that her ceramics exude, seeking the nostalgia of the old.

All pots have been fired at a high temperature to ensure their durability.

Her work includes unique sculptural decor objects, vases, and centerpieces. For her ceramics she uses stoneware clay employing coiling, wheel throwing and sculpting techniques.

She owns the entirety of the creation process, from the conceptual stage and design to the pottery making, sculpting, painting, glaze making, and firing.

Her main source of inspiration is nature, which she finds is full of treasures of various patterns, textures, and shapes.

MUGLY.NYC

MUGLY.NYC is a handcrafted ceramic brand based in Brooklyn, NY. It was founded in 2020 by Ilona Golovina (b. 1987, Stavropol, Russia).

Ilona in her work emphasises and embraces imperfections. Her shapes are inspired by ancient European and Asian ceramic artefacts. Her vessels are rough, textured and raw.

She intentionally leaves cracks and sometimes damages her pieces to give them a timeless feeling. By looking at her work it is sometimes hard to tell if they were made recently of centuries ago.

Tending

London-based Tending curates life enhancing art objects for the home, for living well.

The studio designs and produces its own limited-run and small batch produced collections of extraordinary and unique homeware and useful beautiful objects. All Tending's objects are handmade by small, local and independent workshops, studios and ateliers.

Shell Vessel evokes the form of the lucky double oyster shells which are found scattered on the beaches of Southern Africa. It is from one of these beautiful shells that Shell Vessel was conceived and originally cast. Shell Vessel is designed to be a small functional vessel - used to contain salt on a table, or as a useful double receptacle for small items such as rings or jewelry. Each shell is entirely hand made, cast in recycled glass and this means each shell is organically unique.
